A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ELK GROVE FINDING
THE OLD TOWN UPRR PARCEL FENCE PROJECT EXEMPT FROM THE
CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT AND DIRECTING THE FILING OF A
NOTICE OF EXEMPTION, AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO DETERMINE
THE RESPONSIBLE BIDDER SUBMITTING THE LOWEST RESPONSIBLE BID AND
EXECUTE A CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT WITH AN APPROPRIATE
CONTINGENCY IN A TOTAL AMOUNT NOT-TO-EXCEED \$50,000

WHEREAS, the City of Elk Grove established the Old Town Union Pacific Railroad (UPRR) Parcel Fence Project (WMI001) (Project) to provide fencing to separate it from the adjacent railroad; and

WHEREAS, the design and bidding documents have been completed; and

WHEREAS, the California Environmental Quality Act (Section 21000 et seq. of the Public Resources Code, herein after CEQA) requires that cities consider the environmental consequences of their actions before approving a project; and

WHEREAS, the Project is a project under CEQA; and

WHEREAS, there is sufficient funding for construction within the General Fund; and

WHEREAS, on or about October 26, 2012, the City will advertise for bids for construction of the Project; and

WHEREAS, on or about November 5, 2012, the City will receive bids and due to the need to complete the fencing quickly, the City Manager proposes to determine the responsible bidder submitting the lowest responsive bid as a participant in a public competitive bidding process.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the City Council of the City of Elk Grove hereby finds that the Project exempt from CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15301 based upon the following finding:

<u>Finding:</u> The Old Town UPRR Parcel Fence Project is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines section 15303.

<u>Evidence:</u> The proposed project is exempt from CEQA under State CEQA Guidelines Section 15303 (New Construction or Conversion of Small Structures). A Categorical Exemption Class 3 applies to the construction and location of limited numbers of new, small facilities or structures. Subsection (e) specifically describes accessory structures including garages, carports, swimming pools, and fences. The proposed project
