## **RESOLUTION NO. 2013-43**

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ELK GROVE APPROVING THE APPLICATION FOR GRANT FUNDS FROM SECTION 190 GRADE SEPARATION FUNDS FOR THE GRANT LINE ROAD WIDENING PROJECT (EAST STOCKTON BOULEVARD TO WATERMAN ROAD) AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ACT AS THE CITY'S SIGNATORY FOR SUCH GRANT

WHEREAS, the Legislature and Governor of the State of California have provided funds for grants from Section 190 Grade Separation Funds and Proposition 1B Grade Separation Funds; and

WHEREAS, the California Public Utilities Commission has jurisdiction over the safety of roadway-rail crossings and develops a funding priority list of grade separation projects, and the Grant Line Road Grade Separation Structure is on the current list; and

WHEREAS, said procedures require a resolution certifying the approval of application by the City of Elk Grove governing board before submission of application; and

WHEREAS, the City of Elk Grove has initiated the process for grade separating the crossing at Grant Line Road between East Stockton Boulevard and Waterman Road, having adopted a Mitigated Negative Declaration (SCH #2005102056), as well as four Addenda, as required under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA, Section 21000, et seq, of the California Public Resources Code).

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the City Council of the City of Elk Grove hereby:

- 1) Approves the filing of an application for the Grant Line Road Widening Project (East Stockton Boulevard to Waterman Road) (Project); and
- 2) Certifies that the City of Elk Grove will have all matters prerequisite to awarding the construction contract accomplished within two years after the allocation of the funds by the California Transportation Commission; and
- 3) Certifies that the City of Elk Grove will have sufficient funds to complete the Project, or will secure the resources to do so; and
- 4) If applicable, certifies that the Project will comply with any laws and regulations including, but not limited to, the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), legal requirements for building codes, health and safety codes, disabled access laws, and, that prior to commencement of construction all applicable permits will have been obtained.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Elk Grove hereby authorizes the City of Elk Grove City Manager, or designee, to act as the City's agent to conduct all negotiations, execute and submit all documents including, but not limited to applications, agreements, payment requests and so on, which may be necessary for the completion of the aforementioned Project.
