RESOLUTION NO. 2020-230

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ELK GROVE ALLOCATING THE CARES NONPROFIT GRANT PROGRAM FUNDING

WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic has had a significant negative financial effect on many of Elk Grove's nonprofit organizations, which have seen increased demand for services and/or a loss in revenue associated with shutdown and "stay at home" orders; and

WHEREAS, on July 22, 2020, the City Council established a budget for funding allocated to the City from the California Department of Finance in accordance with the State of California Budget Act of 2020 and the Federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act of 2020, and amended the City's Fiscal Year 2019-2020 and Fiscal Year 2020-2021 Budgets to include \$200,000 for nonprofit grants to assist those that have been negatively impacted economically by the COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, on August 12, 2020, the City Council adopted the CARES Nonprofit Grant Program ("Program") Guidelines, outlining eligible organizations and an application and review process; and

WHEREAS, a Program application was publicly available from August 14 to August 28, 2020, and subsequently a review panel comprised of community members reviewed the eligible applications and made funding recommendations to the City Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Elk Grove hereby allocates the CARES Nonprofit Grant Program funding, consistent with the amounts described in Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein, and authorizes the City Manager to implement the funding awards consistent with the Program Guidelines and in accordance with state and federal requirements.
