#### ORDINANCE NO. 2-2007

# AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ELK GROVE AMENDING THE CITY OF ELK GROVE ZONING MAP FROM AR-10 TO RD-3, RD-4 AND RD-5 FOR DIAMANTE SUBDIVISION PROJECT NO. EG-05-977

APNs: 127-0140-009 AND 127-0140-010

The City Council of the City of Elk Grove does ordain as follows:

## Section 1: Purpose and Authority

The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend the City of Elk Grove Zoning Map as shown on attached Exhibit A.

Section 2: Findings

#### CEQA

<u>Finding</u>: On the basis of the whole record, there is no substantial evidence that the project as designed, conditioned and mitigated will have a significant effect on the environment. A Mitigated Negative Declaration has been prepared and completed in accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). The Mitigated Negative Declaration reflects the independent judgment and analysis of the City.

<u>Evidence</u>: An Initial Study with a Mitigated Negative Declaration evaluating the potential environmental effects of the project was prepared for the proposed project. Potentially significant adverse effects related to aesthetics, biological resources, and hazards & hazardous materials were identified in the Initial Study. Mitigation Measures have been imposed on the project and the Applicant has agreed to implement proposed Mitigation Measures that reduce the impacts to a less than significant level. Preparation of a Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program (MMRP) is required in accordance with City of Elk Grove regulations and is designed to ensure compliance during project implementation.

The City distributed the Notice of Intent to Adopt the Negative Declaration on October 25, 2006. It was posted at the Sacramento County Clerk's Office, distributed through the State Clearinghouse, and at the City offices pursuant to CEQA Guidelines 15072. A 30 day review and comment period was opened on October 25, 2006 and closed on November 23, 2006. The Mitigated Negative Declaration was made available to the public during this review period.

#### General Plan

<u>Finding</u>: The project is consistent with the goals and policies of the Elk Grove General Plan and East Elk Grove Specific Plan.

Evidence: The subject project as conditioned creates eighty-six (86) new residential parcels from a 20.15 acre project site. The Elk Grove General Plan designates the site as Estate Residential (0.6 to 4.0 dwelling units per acre) and Low Density Residential Use (4.1 to 7.0 dwelling units per acre). The East Elk Grove Specific Plan (EEGSP) designates the site for residential development at densities of 2-4, 4, and 5 units per acre. The EEGSP does allow a one (1) dwelling unit per acre increase above the EEGSP residential density designation as a matter of right. The site is suitable for residential development and is consistent with surrounding parcels which consist of residential uses and undeveloped parcels.

#### Rezone

<u>Finding</u>: The proposed rezone is in the public interest (Section 65358(a) of the Government Code.

<u>Evidence</u>: The Applicant's proposal is consistent with the allowed density ranges and uses in the Elk Grove General Plan, General Plan Land Use Map, and East Elk Grove Specific Plan. The proposed rezoning meets all applicable standards of the Elk Grove Zoning Code. The proposed project implements the General Plan's objectives for orderly and systematic development and responds to opportunities and constraints in the local community area.

#### Section 3: Action

The City Council hereby amends the City of Elk Grove Zoning Map for APNs 127-0140-009 and 127-0140-010 as shown on attached Exhibit A subject to the findings contained in this Ordinance.

## Section 4: No Mandatory Duty of Care.

This ordinance is not intended to and shall not be construed or given effect in a manner that imposes upon the City or any officer or employee thereof a mandatory duty of care towards persons and property within or without the City, so as to provide a basis of civil liability for damages, except as otherwise imposed by law.

## Section 5: Severability.

If any provision of this ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are severable. This City

Council hereby declares that it would have adopted this ordinance irrespective of the invalidity of any particular portion thereof and intends that the invalid portions should be severed and the balance of the ordinance be enforced.

# Section 6: Effective Date and Publication

This Ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after its adoption. In lieu of publication of the full text of the ordinance within 15 days after its passage, a summary of the ordinance may be published at least five days prior to and fifteen (15) days after adoption by the City Council and a certified copy shall be posted in the office of the City Clerk, pursuant to GC 36933(c)(1).


