ORDINANCE NO. 26-2014

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ELK GROVE AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONTRACT BETWEEN THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ELK GROVE AND THE BOARD OF ADMINISTRATION OF THE CALIFORNIA PUBLIC EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM

The City Council of the City of Elk Grove does ordain as follows:

Section 1: Contract Amendment.

That an amendment to the contract between the City Council of the City of Elk Grove and the Board of Administration of the California Public Employees' Retirement System is hereby authorized, a copy of said amendment being attached hereto, marked Exhibit A, and by such reference made a part hereof as though herein set out in full.

Section 2: Execution Authority.

The Mayor of the City Council of the City of Elk Grove is hereby authorized, empowered, and directed to execute said amendment for and on behalf of said Agency.

Section 3: Severability.

If any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Ordinance are severable. This City Council declares that it would have adopted this Ordinance irrespective of the invalidity of any particular portion thereof and intends that the invalid portions should be severed and the balance of the Ordinance be enforced.

Section 4: No Mandatory Duty of Care.

This ordinance is not intended to and shall not be construed or given effect in a manner that imposes upon the City or any officer or employee thereof a mandatory duty of care towards persons and property within or without the City, so as to provide a basis of civil liability for damages, except as otherwise imposed by law.

Section 5: Effective Date and Publication.

This Ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after its adoption. In lieu of publication of the full text of the ordinance within fifteen (15) days after its passage, a summary of the ordinance may be published at least five (5) days prior to and fifteen (15) days after adoption by the City Council and a certified copy shall be posted in the Office of the City Clerk, pursuant to GC 36933(c)(1).

AMENDMENT TO CONTRACT

Between the
Board of Administration
California Public Employees' Retirement System
and the
City Council
City of Elk Grove



The Board of Administration, California Public Employees' Retirement System, hereinafter referred to as Board, and the governing body of the above public agency, hereinafter referred to as Public Agency, having entered into a contract effective October 16, 2001, and witnessed September 7, 2001, and as amended effective September 16, 2002, July 3, 2004, November 16, 2005, January 9, 2010, August 12, 2012 and December 15, 2013 which provides for participation of Public Agency in said System, Board and Public Agency hereby agree as follows:

- A. Paragraphs 1 through 15 are hereby stricken from said contract as executed effective December 15, 2013, and hereby replaced by the following paragraphs numbered 1 through 15 inclusive:
 - 1. All words and terms used herein which are defined in the Public Employees' Retirement Law shall have the meaning as defined therein unless otherwise specifically provided. "Normal retirement age" shall mean age 55 for local miscellaneous members, age 50 for local safety members entering membership in the safety classification on or prior to August 12, 2012 and age 55 for local safety members entering membership for the first time in the safety classification after August 12, 2012.

PLEASE DO NOT SIGN "EXHIBIT C

- Public Agency shall participate in the Public Employees' Retirement System from and after October 16, 2001 making its employees as hereinafter provided, members of said System subject to all provisions of the Public Employees' Retirement Law except such as apply only on election of a contracting agency and are not provided for herein and to all amendments to said Law hereafter enacted except those, which by express provisions thereof, apply only on the election of a contracting agency.
- 3. Public Agency agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the California Public Employees' Retirement System (CalPERS) and its trustees, agents and employees, the CalPERS Board of Administration, and the California Public Employees' Retirement Fund from any claims, demands, actions, losses, liabilities, damages, judgments, expenses and costs, including but not limited to interest, penalties and attorneys fees that may arise as a result of any of the following:
 - (a) Public Agency's election to provide retirement benefits, provisions or formulas under this Contract that are different than the retirement benefits, provisions or formulas provided under the Public Agency's prior non-CalPERS retirement program.
 - (b) Any dispute, disagreement, claim, or proceeding (including without limitation arbitration, administrative hearing, or litigation) between Public Agency and its employees (or their representatives) which relates to Public Agency's election to amend this Contract to provide retirement benefits, provisions or formulas that are different than such employees' existing retirement benefits, provisions or formulas
 - (c) Public Agency's agreement with a third party other than CalPERS to provide retirement benefits, provisions, or formulas that are different than the retirement benefits, provisions or formulas provided under this Contract and provided for under the California Public Employees' Retirement Law.
- 4. Employees of Public Agency in the following classes shall become members of said Retirement System except such in each such class as are excluded by law or this agreement:
 - a. Local Police Officers (herein referred to as local safety members);
 - b. Employees other than local safety members (herein referred to as local miscellaneous members).

5. In addition to the classes of employees excluded from membership by said Retirement Law, the following classes of employees shall not become members of said Retirement System:

a. FIREFIGHTERS.

- 6. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited prior and current service as a local miscellaneous member in employment before and not on or after September 16, 2002 shall be determined in accordance with Section 21354 of said Retirement Law (2% at age 55 Full).
- 7. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited prior and current service as a local miscellaneous member in employment on or after September 16, 2002 and not entering membership for the first time in the miscellaneous classification after August 12, 2012 shall be determined in accordance with Section 21354.5 of said Retirement Law (2.7% at age 55 Full).
- 8. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited current service as a local miscellaneous member entering membership for the first time in the miscellaneous classification after August 12, 2012 shall be determined in accordance with Section 21354 of said Retirement Law (2% at age 55 Full).
- 9. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited prior and current service as a local safety member entering membership in the safety classification on or prior to August 12, 2012 shall be determined in accordance with Section 21362.2 of said Retirement Law (3% at age 50 Full).
- 10. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited current service as a local safety member entering membership for the first time in the safety classification after August 12, 2012 shall be determined in accordance with Section 21363.1 of said Retirement Law (3% at age 55 Full).
- 11. Public Agency elected and elects to be subject to the following optional provisions:
 - a. Section 20042 (One-Year Final Compensation).
 - Section 21024 (Military Service Credit as Public Service) for local miscellaneous members.
 - Section 21023.5 (Public Service Credit for Peace Corps, AmeriCorps VISTA, or AmeriCorps Service) for local miscellaneous members.

PLEASE DO NOT SIGN "EXHIBIT ONL"

- d. Section 20903 (Two Years Additional Service Credit).
- e. Section 20475 (Different Level of Benefits). Section 21354 (2% @ 55 Full formula) is applicable to local miscellaneous members entering membership for the first time in the miscellaneous classification after August 12, 2012

Section 21363.1 (3% @ 55 Full formula) is applicable to local safety members entering membership for the first time in the safety classification after August 12, 2012.

f. Section 20516 (Employees Sharing Additional Cost):

From and after December 15, 2013, 3% for local police members in the Police Managers' Association.

From and after the effective date of this amendment to contract, 3% for local police members in the Police Officers Association.

- 12. Public Agency shall contribute to said Retirement System the contributions determined by actuarial valuations of prior and future service liability with respect to local miscellaneous members and local safety members of said Retirement System.
- 13. Public Agency shall also contribute to said Retirement System as follows:
 - a. Contributions required per covered member on account of the 1959 Survivor Benefits provided under Section 21574 of said Retirement Law. (Subject to annual change.) In addition, all assets and liabilities of Public Agency and its employees shall be pooled in a single account, based on term insurance rates, for survivors of all local miscellaneous members and local safety members.
 - b. A reasonable amount, as fixed by the Board, payable in one installment within 60 days of date of contract to cover the costs of administering said System as it affects the employees of Public Agency, not including the costs of special valuations or of the periodic investigation and valuations required by law.
 - c. A reasonable amount, as fixed by the Board, payable in one installment as the occasions arise, to cover the costs of special valuations on account of employees of Public Agency, and costs of the periodic investigation and valuations required by law.

- 14. Contributions required of Public Agency and its employees shall be subject to adjustment by Board on account of amendments to the Public Employees' Retirement Law, and on account of the experience under the Retirement System as determined by the periodic investigation and valuation required by said Retirement Law.
- 15. Contributions required of Public Agency and its employees shall be paid by Public Agency to the Retirement System within fifteen days after the end of the period to which said contributions refer or as may be prescribed by Board regulation. If more or less than the correct amount of contributions is paid for any period, proper adjustment shall be made in connection with subsequent remittances. Adjustments on account of errors in contributions required of any employee may be made by direct payments between the employee and the Board.
