Dear Mr. Jordan,

I am replying to you on behalf of our Assessor Christina Wynn regarding your letter requesting reassessment information in the City of Elk Grove. Since you may have property owners concerned about the rezoning of their property, here are answers to your four specific questions regarding how their property may be impacted.

1) How does the zoning of a property impact the establishment of a property's assessed value.

**Answer:** Zoning can impact the market value of a property because of the type of improvements or use that are allowed on it (i.e. retail vs. residential). This, however, would not immediately impact the current assessed value since rezoning would not trigger a reassessment.

2) If a property is rezoned, is this a qualifying event for reassessment of the property or for otherwise changing the ad valorem tax (either the assessed value or the countywide tax rate)?

**Answer**: No, rezoning is not a qualifying event for reassessment of a property. The countywide tax rate of one percent is the same for all parcels in the county.

3) Does the answer to question 2 change if the rezoning is initiated by the City rather than by the property owner?

Answer: No.
