# City of Elk Grove Amendment #3 to 2019-20 Action Plan

The following amendment language will be added to the 2019-20 Action Plan to allow the City to reallocated unspent Community Development Block Grant CARES Act Stimulus funding intended to assist in making a timely response to the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic.

#### **AP-05 Executive Summary**

#### 1. Introduction

On March 27, 2020, Congress passed the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act. The Act identified additional funding for the Community Development Block Grant to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the community impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic. HUD's distribution plan for the additional funding included multiple phases that would allow for quick access to funding necessary to address the immediate crisis resulting from the rising pandemic, as well as phases that would support post-pandemic community recovery.

During the first phase, the City of Elk Grove received \$543,435 in Community Development Block Grant CARES Act Stimulus (CDBG-CV) funding. City Council approved amendments to the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Citizen Participation Plan, 2013-2018 Consolidated Plan (extended to June 2020) and 2019-20 Action Plan to allocate these funds on May 13, 2020. The second phase of distribution included \$1 billion of allocations to States and insular areas within 45 days of enactment of the Act. Elk Grove did not receive an allocation for phase two. The remaining \$2 billion in CDBG-CV funding was distributed to state and local governments according to a formula that considered public health needs, risk of transmission of coronavirus, number of coronavirus cases compared to the national average, and economic and housing market disruptions. In this third phase of distribution, Elk Grove received an additional \$762,071 in CDBG-CV funding. On January 13, 2021 Council approved amendments to the CDBG 2013-2018 Consolidated Plan (extended to June 2020) and 2019-20 Action Plan to allocate these funds.

This Action Plan amendment addresses the planning requirement for the reallocation of \$610,917 in funds from CDBG-CV projects that did not expend or are not anticipated to expend their full funding allocation.

#### 2. Summary of the objectives and outcomes identified in the Plan

The priorities for the City's COVID-19 response are:

- Maintaining or improving access to public services; and
- Addressing and preventing homelessness.

These objectives were derived from continuing data showing that COVID-19 will exacerbate existing needs. Public services, including nutrition support and housing assistance, particularly for households suffering loss of income, and support for persons experiencing homelessness are key programmatic needs that have been identified in the CARES Act.

#### 4. Summary of Citizen Participation Process and consultation process

The public comment period for this Action Plan amendment is twelve days, consistent with HUD's waiver and the City's Citizen Participation Plan, to expedite the CARES Act funding to address the immediate needs facing communities impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. The public comment period exceeds the minimum of five days allowed by HUD's waiver.

The draft Action Plan amendment is available for comment from all interested parties from June 11, 2021, through June 23, 2021. A public hearing will be held on June 23, 2021 according to public participation requirements detailed in the Citizen Participation Plan.

#### 1. Summary of citizen participation process/Efforts made to broaden citizen participation

Summarize citizen participation process and how it impacted goal-setting.

At the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, City staff surveyed essential services nonprofits that are funded through the City's Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) or Community Services Grant (CSG) programs. These nonprofits were identified as providing food or household supplies, monetary support, or significant social supports to vulnerable populations, including low-wage workers, senior citizens, and people experiencing homelessness.

Through continued outreach and discussion with nonprofit partners providing essential services, the City was able to assess community needs related to COVID-19 and identify funding priorities.

**CV1** – The amended Citizen Participation Plan and the amendments to the 2013-2018 Consolidated Plan (extended through June 2020) and 2019-20 Action Plan were released for a 5-day public review period on May 8, 2020, with a public notice of availability published in the Elk Grove Citizen on May 6, 2020. A public hearing, with opportunity for public comment, was held during the May 13, 2020 City Council meeting.

**CV3** – The amendments to the 2013-2018 Consolidated Plan (extended through June 2020) and 2019-20 Action Plan were released for a 13-day public review period on January 1, 2021, with a public notice of availability published in the Elk Grove Citizen on the same date. A public hearing, with opportunity for public comment, was held during the January 13, 2021 City Council meeting.

**Reallocation of unspent CDBG-CV** – The amendment to the 2019-20 Action Plan was released for a 12-day public review period on June 11, 2021, with a public notice of availability published in the Elk Grove Citizen on the same date. A public hearing, with opportunity for public comment, will be held during the June 23, 2021 City Council meeting.
