MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING**

This Memorandum of Understanding is dated as of _____, by and between the SACRAMENTO TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY (Authority) and the CITY OF ELK GROVE (CITY).

WHEREAS, the City, along with seven other public entities and the Authority (Exhibit A), has endorsed the concept of a Countywide transportation and air quality collaborative of public agencies and stakeholder organizations to coordinate a comprehensive, long-range transportation and air quality improvement strategy for Sacramento County; and

WHEREAS, the City has resolved to contribute a pro rata share—not to exceed \$3,665—of the funding required to implement the Sacramento Transportation & Air Quality Collaborative (Collaborative) during FY 2001-02; and

WHEREAS, the City agrees that the Authority will be the administering agency for the Collaborative, and

WHEREAS, the Authority has resolved to contribute up to \$225,000 of Measure A administration funds to implement the Collaborative during FY 2001-02;

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED:

1. Authority shall continue to provide administrative services in support of the Sacramento Transportation & Air Quality Collaborative during FY 2001-02.
2. City shall reimburse Authority for Authority's payments in support of the Collaborative FY 2001-02 at a rate of 0.4% of total annual expenditures or \$3,665 whichever is less.
3. Authority shall invoice City for its pro rata share of actual expenditures hereunder, not more often than monthly. City shall reimburse Authority within thirty (30) days after receipt of invoice.
