Purpose

The purpose of this course is to provide the student with updated techniques and skills to efficient work as a field-deployed or communications center-deployed Tactical Dispatcher working critical incidents.

Learning Outcomes

When deployed to the field or within the communications center, Tactical Dispatch students who complete this update course will be able to use new techniques and skills to help efficiently establish incident command posts, track and document resources, recognize needs of involved resources through incident debriefings, updated how to accurately obtain additional resources when necessary, and current best practices for deployments.
